Asking the questions of SEARCH

What is it I really need?

Is there a book to read? A group to get into?

Who are three people I need to talk to?

Who is currently where I want to be?

Can I learn from him/her? Use their "map"?

Is there an old map I need to get rid of?

Who in my life needs to know? Whom do I need to inform?

What has my focus or attention that's influencing my path?

Does something or someone need my attention or focus?

Is there a phone call I need to make? A hard conversation to have?

Is there something I need to own; to take responsibility for?

Is there an attitude or perspective I need?

What spiritual disciplines will need to be in place?

Do I need to... break up, move out, reconcile, forgive, ask for forgiveness
sell something, disconnect something, buy something?

What's the first step I need to take?

NEXT STEPS

Ask God to show you a specific area of your life
and commit to search it out with the questions listed above.

Ask God to build into you the courage you'll need
to take the first step toward change in that area of your life.

Take the step of applying these and other questions
to the path you need to change – identify your process.
